




ABOUT THIS QUALIFICATION

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Candidates need to:

- Complete the Cambridge International Certificate in Teaching and Learning (Module 1).
- Complete Module 2 of the Cambridge International Diploma in Teaching and Learning.
- Be a full- or part-time teacher employed in an educational institution such as a school, college, university, or adult training centre.
- Teach in their current school over a full academic year, for a minimum of 24 weeks and a minimum of six hours per week.
- Teach a group with a minimum of six learners. Be responsible for planning, teaching and formatively assessing groups of learners.
- Have English language competence comparable to Level B2 in the CEFR or a minimum requirement of 5.5 on the IELTS.

COURSE CONTENT

UNIT 1: Understanding Reflective Practice

This unit introduces the importance of reflective practice, engaging candidates with various theories and models. Candidates will learn to explain what reflective practice is, why it is important, and how it can be applied in their daily teaching.

UNIT 2: Understanding Learning

Candidates will explore theories of learning and understand how students build new knowledge. The unit covers the concepts of how students learn, retain new information, solve problems, and the role of motivation. Candidates will also examine effective learning structures and active learning methods.

UNIT 3: Understanding Teaching

This unit delves into effective teaching approaches and planning for learning and assessment. Candidates will analyse teaching methods, learning activities, and understand the purpose of assessment and feedback. They will also learn to create and evaluate effective lesson plans.

UNIT 4: Understanding Wider Professional Role as a Teacher

Candidates will explore their roles beyond the classroom, focusing on the broader school environment. This unit emphasises collaboration with other stakeholders, ensuring safety and well-being, and evaluating the impact of the school environment on teaching and learning.

UNIT 5: Understanding Barriers to Learning

This unit helps candidates identify and address barriers to learning in their classrooms. Candidates will explore physical, social, and emotional factors affecting learning and develop strategies to overcome these barriers and promote inclusive education.

UNIT 6: Applying Understanding

Candidates will apply their learning by planning and teaching a lesson using active learning approaches. This unit emphasises the practical application of theoretical knowledge, with candidates evaluating their teaching practice and identifying areas for further development through reflection and feedback.
